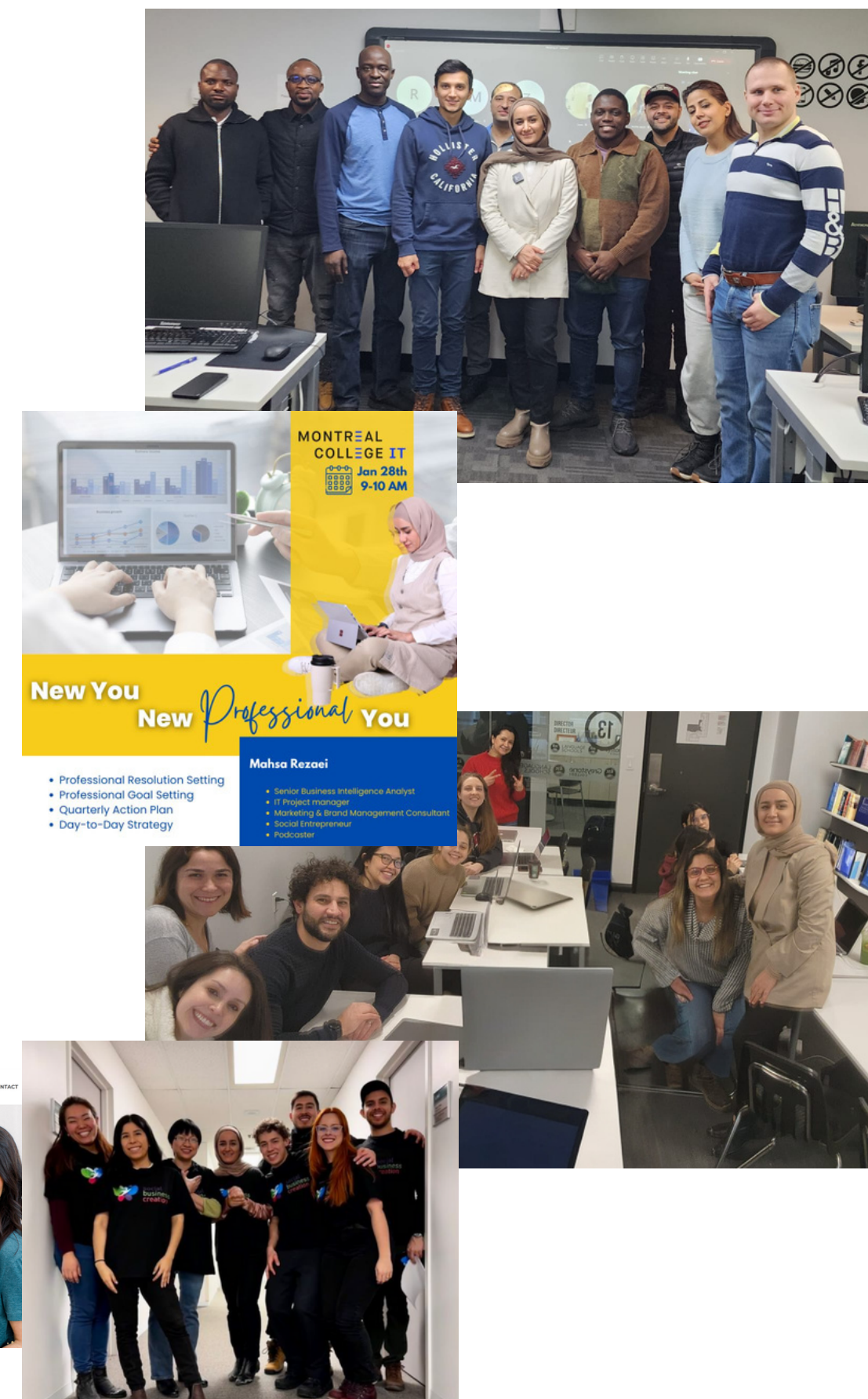
What I've done in 11 months in canada!

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Abstract

In this study, the relationship between the English proficiency and economic development of Asian countries is analyzed using panel data regression. The results indicate that English proficiency exerts a significant effect on economic development, but the effect is fully mediated by economic policies. Additionally, moderation effect analysis reveals that the policy of English as an official language is not a determinant of economic development for high-income Asian countries. Therefore, non-English-speaking countries with no history of colonization by an English-speaking country should prioritize English education reforms, which are more practical than enacting a bilingual nation policy.

Having the capacity to communicate in a common language is centrally important when people access and utilize health, social, and settlement services. While a considerable portion of recent immigrant women to Canada speak English or French fluently, many others do not command either official language fluently enough to access and utilize available health care services. In this qualitative study, data were collected with service providers who work with newcomer women, with women who became fluent in English after arriving in Canada, and with women who do not currently speak English. We report on the challenges women face in acquiring proficiency in English and, through the use of a social determinants of health framework, on how limited language skills negatively influence the health of these immigrant women and their families. We also present a number of strategies that health professionals could use to better support women's attempts to ensure their health and that of their families.

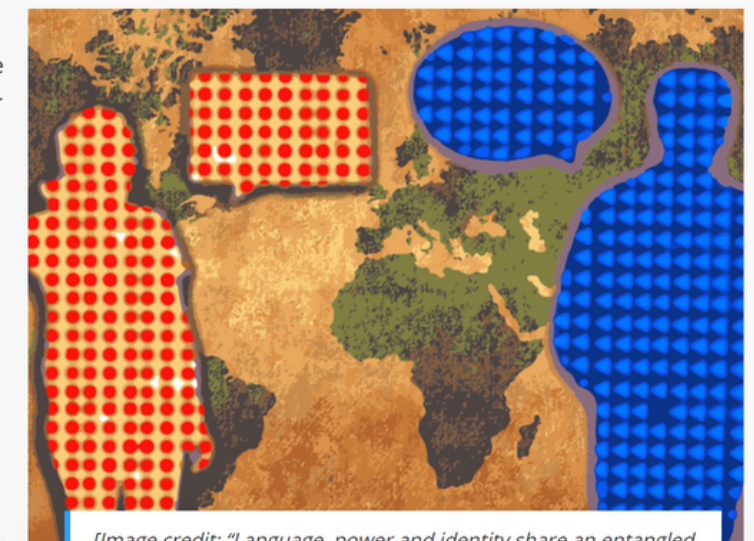
Language Barriers to Social Participation

When Yu Qi (not her real name) discovered her son was falling behind in school, she had no way of finding out why or how she could support him. After getting injured at work, Venus (not her real name) was asked by her supervisor to delay seeking medical attention until she had finished her shift. She was unaware of her rights.

Yu Qi and Venus are both victims of a language barrier in Australia that seriously affects their wellbeing. Language barriers can make public communication inaccessible and exclude people from equitable participation in education, employment, healthcare, welfare, and all aspects of social life.

The number of people who suffer from linguistic exclusion is high. UNESCO estimates that 40 percent of students worldwide experience a mismatch between their language repertoires and the language of instruction. Even within OECD countries, the literacy skills of over 30 percent of the adult population are insufficient to cope with complex bureaucratic demands.

Employment rates for men and women with and without children, 20-to-49 year-olds, by marital status, Canada, 2021

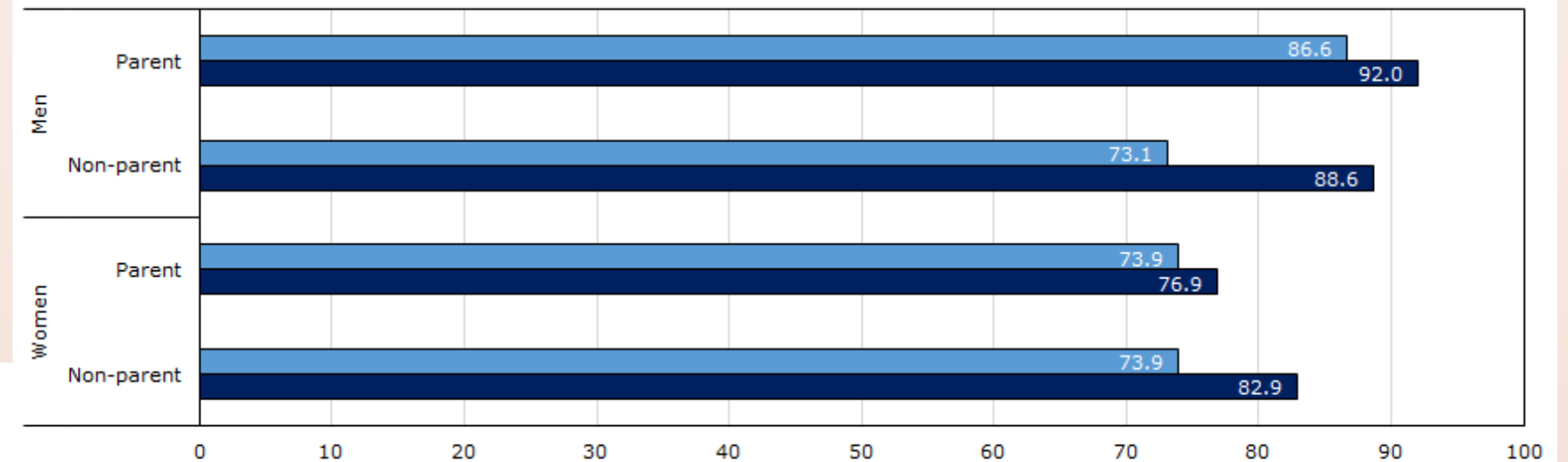
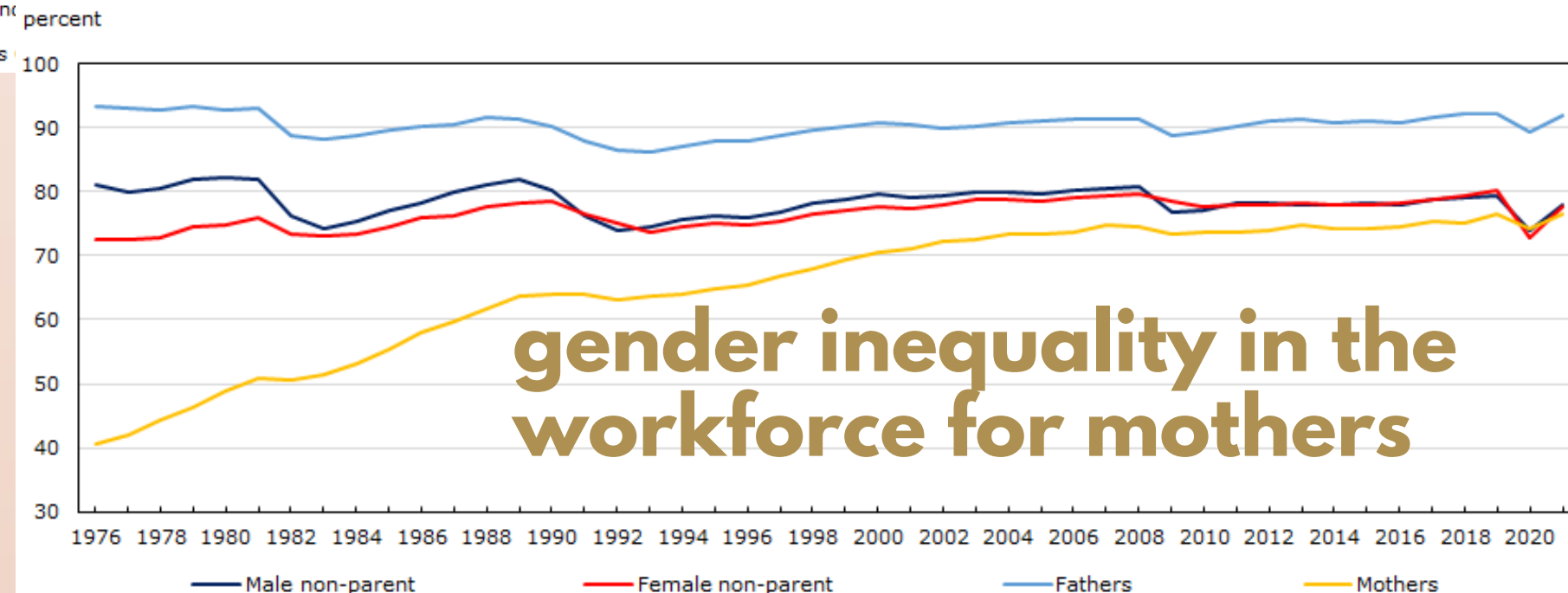
